Last year, 41 students from across the United States attended the School's first annual Diversity and Explorations Program. A distinctive feature of the Diversity and Explorations Program was how it differed from typical recruiting events, in which the target audience is generally graduating college seniors and a handful of juniors. Following a "pipeline" model, according to Counts, one of the key objectives of the program was to educate, not recruit, students of all undergraduate levels who may not fully understand the mission of a divinity school or what one does with a degree from a seminary.
