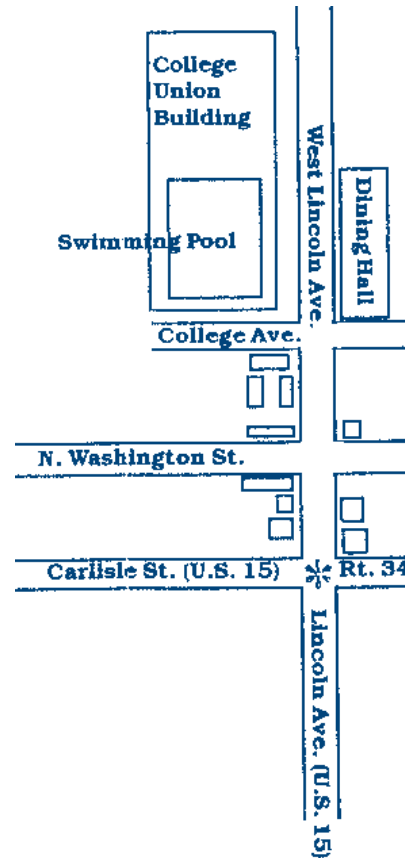
Doctor's Permission: This will certify that the camper has had a physical as of August 1, 2008 and is qualified to attend the camp listed in this application.

Michael Rawleigh Gettysburg College Head Coach

Rawleigh is in his twenty-fourth year as the head swimming coach at Gettysburg College. During his tenure at Gettysburg, Rawleigh's men's teams have compiled a 129-33 dual meet record and have won twelve Conference championships. The Gettysburg women's teams have posted a 155-11-2 dual meet mark while capturing 16 conference titles.

Rawleigh came to Gettysburg after serving as assistant men's and women's coach at the University of North Carolina. A native of High Point, North Carolina, he was a sprinter for the Tar Heels during his collegiate career.

Rawleigh is known for his ability to motivate swimmers and communicate with athletes of all age groups.

Coaches



Jeff Miller Gettysburg College Assistant Coach

Jeff Miller enters his third season as a member of the Gettysburg coaching staff. A 2003 graduate of Gettysburg, he was a four-year letterwinner for the Bullet swimming team. Miller served the team as a captain in his junior and senior seasons. Along with Dave Walters, Justin Fanslau and Sean O'Connor, he was a member of the 800-meter freestyle relay team that set the

Gettysburg record in 7:01.57 at the 2003 Centennial Conference meet. A native of Baldwinsville, N.Y., Miller coached the Baldwinsville Sharks swim club in the Spring of 2006.



Cami Rawleigh Gettysburg College Assistant Coach

Rawleigh, a native of Greenwich, CT, was a four-year letter winner at the University of North Carolina from 1981-84. While swimming for UNC, she earned NCAA Division I All-America honors 13 times. She was a member of the American record setting 200 yard medley relay team in 1981.

Rawleigh also attended the U.S. Olympic Festival twice. Her coaching experience includes one year with the Chapel Hill YMCA Swim Club, her current coaching with husband Mike at Gettysburg, and private instruction to local age group swimmers.



Dick Guyer York Suburban High School Head Coach

Guyer has coached at York Suburban High School for over 30 years. His teams have posted a combined 499-87-1 dual meet record with 11 District III PIAA titles and 54 Individual PIAA District III Champions. He has coached 8 PIAA State Champions and 47 First Team High School All-Americans.

After graduating from Lock Haven State College in 1968, Coach Guyer received his Master Equivalency from Penn State University in 1975. He is the Co-Founder of Swimmar Clinics and he has been a clinician at swimming clinics in 8 different states. Coach Guyer has co-authored four nationally published books on the four competitive strokes. In 1987 he was inducted into the Pennsylvania Swimmers Hall of Fame, and in 1991 won the NISCA Pennsylvania Outstanding Service Award.

Guyer has over twenty years of camp experience and he is regarded as one of the most outstanding clinicians in the country.

Counselors

Camp counselors will be mature, responsible individuals chosen by the camp administrators to provide each camper with a safe, positive experience. Counselors will live in the dormitories with the swimmers, supervise them at night, attend meals with the swimmers, and assist coaches during pool instruction. There will be 24-hour supervision of campers at Gettysburg Swimming Camp.

Lodging

All overnight campers will be housed on the campus at Gettysburg College. Campers are reminded to bring bed sheets or sleeping bags, blankets, pillows, a fan, towels, and toilet articles.

Meals

Breakfast, lunch, and dinner will be served to all overnight campers. Saturday dinner through Thursday lunch in the dining facility located across the street from the pool. Day campers will be served lunch and dinner.
