

Biographical Note

The majority of the letters in this collection were written by R.T. Mathews—known as "Roy"—and his brother R.A. Mathews—"Ron"—to their uncle in America, Robert J. McNally, as they struggled through World War II, Ron as a soldier and Roy as he moves his family through bombed English cities. Others involved in the letters are T.A. Mathews—the father of Roy and Ron—and his sister Winnie.

Historical Note

This collection notes the impact the German "Blitz" had on the British people, from destroying homes to entire cities. Named after the German word "blitzkrieg," meaning "lightning war," from September 1940 to May 1941 German aircraft dropped bombs on British cities like London in an attempt to hurt strategic cities and the morale of British citizens.¹

Scope and Content Note

Primarily covering the years between 1939 and 1943, this collection details specifics of British Army life during the Second World War, such as a soldier's schedule, interaction with family, and types of work needed. It also covers topics relating to American-British relations during WWII, as the men write from Britain to an American audience (their uncle or father), and the recipient of these letters attempts to house a child from war-torn England, receiving a letter on why this offer has fallen through thus far.
