Biographical Note

Born on May 23, 1941, in Washington, DC, Martin Puryear is an acclaimed American artist. Throughout his career, Puryear has participated in various renowned exhibitions and received prestigious grants and awards. Including the Individual Artist Fellowship from the NEA, the Guggenheim Fellowship, and the MacArthur Fellowship. His work has been featured in various museums including the Whitney Museum of American Art and the Museum of Modern Art with the self-titled exhibition "Martin Puryear." Puryear has also worked in France at the invitation of the French Government and in 2011 he was awarded the National Medal of Arts by President Barack Obama.¹

Molly Hutton was the Director of Gettysburg College's Schmucker Art Gallery from 2002 to 2007.

Historical Note

Established by the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), the Art in Public Places Grant's goal was to make the best in contemporary art accessible to the public and to give new opportunities to living American artists. After being awarded the Art in Public Places Grant, Gettysburg College matched funds and commissioned sculptor Martin Puryear to build a sculpture on campus. The sculpture, *Sentinel*, commemorates the school's sesquicentennial anniversary.²

Scope and Content Note

This collection includes records from Gettysburg College's application process to the NEA, the selection process of the artist, images from the installation process of *Sentinel*, correspondence and an interview

with Martin Puryear, newspaper cutouts of *Sentinel's* reception. As well as records from Molly Hutton's efforts to seek awareness and funding for the preservation and conservation of *Sentinel* in the early 2000s.
