#### **Biographical Note**

A native of East Stroudsburg, Pennsylvania, Jeffrey Jones entered Gettysburg College in the fall of 1968. After drifting between subject areas, he found focus in psychology. He was a member of Phi Sigma Kappa, and participated in campus dramatics with the Owl & Nightingale Society. Earning graduate degrees at the University of Richmond and the University of South Florida, Jones worked as an industrial/organizational psychologist at several corporations before going into business as a private consultant. He is now retired.

#### Scope and Content Note

This is a small but useful "institutional" collection: as well as handwritten letters from Jones to his parents, detailing his activities and showcasing wisdoms acquired in class, there are several types of official notifications routinely sent by the College to students and parents. This collection offers a peek inside the mailbox of a characteristic Gettysburg student in 1968–1972. (Researchers seeking a psychological portrait of a youth undergoing many of the cultural and social changes endemic to the period are referred to the oral history and written reflections appended to this collection.)

#### **Series Descriptions**

The collection comprises three series: **Series I. Correspondence**, letters written by Jeffrey Jones to his family while at Gettysburg College, and communications from the College to Jones or his parents; **Series II. Official Documents**, transcripts, bills, and receipts from the offices of the College Registrar and Bursar; and **Series III: Additional Items**, college-related miscellany, plus Jeffrey Jones's autobiographical reflections on his early life and years at Gettysburg.
