## **CITI Modules for Anthropology Students**

Honors students working with human subjects must complete the following CITI modules, which teach and test individuals on the basic principles and federal guidelines for conducting research with human subjects. Depending on the research, the department's IRB representative (Donna Perry) may ask you to complete one or more additional modules relevant to your project. After completing all required modules and receiving a minimum cumulative score of 80%, student must print up a certificate and submit it to the department's IRB representative, Donna Perry.
Honors students must also read and sign the department's ethics contract, submitting it to Donna

Perry. •Finally, honors students must also submit project details to Donna Perry for IRB approval (contact her for information on what to submit: dperry@gettysburg.edu)
