Standardized Test	<ul> <li>Optometry Admission Test (OAT)</li> <li>Take after general biology, general chemistry, organic chemistry, and physics are completed</li> <li>Website: www.opted.org</li> <li>Given virtually daily</li> <li>Register on-line</li> <li>Length ~ 280 minutes</li> <li>4 sections : Survey of the Natural Sciences (Biology, General Chemistry, Organic Chemistry), Reading Comprehension, Physics, Quantitative Reasoning</li> <li>Receive scores immediately</li> <li>Scaled scores range from 200 to 400; 300 is national average</li> <li>Resources at www.opted.org: <ul> <li>OAT Guide</li> <li>Test preparation materials and sample test</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Length of Program	<ul> <li>Optometry school: 4 years</li> <li>Optional 1 year residency</li> </ul>
Degree	Doctor of Optometry (OD)
