

#### ABOUT THE DIRECTORS

Christopher J. Heffner received his Bachelor of Music Education from Western Kentucky University his Master of Music in trumpet performance, and Doctor of Philosophy with an emphasis in windband conducting from the University of Florida. He taught initially at Todd County Central High School in Elkton, KY and is currently serving as Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Music at Lebanon Valley College. Dr. Heffner is excited to serve as a guest conductor of the Gettysburg College Wind Symphony for this Gala Concert. At Lebanon Valley College, he directs the "Pride of the Valley" marching band, LVC symphonic band and Wind Ensemble. Dr. Heffner teaches a variety of music education classes as well as private trumpet studio at Lebanon Valley College. He remains active as a guest conductor and clinician working with groups from Pennsylvania, Kentucky, Louisiana, and Florida. Dr. Heffner is a member of National Association for Music Educators, College Band Directors National Association, and Pennsylvania Music Educators Association. He is also a member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity, and an honorary member of Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma.

**Paul Carr,** a Houston native and 1985 Howard University graduate, has dedicated his professional career to jazz performance and education. He has recorded five CD's which have been well received by critics and jazz fans alike. Touring Russia, Europe, the Middle East, the Caribbean, and Central and South America, Mr. Carr has shared the stage with many of the greatest names in jazz. In 2002, he founded the Jazz Academy of Music, which hosts summer camps and jazz ensembles for kids throughout the year. In 2010, he founded the Mid-Atlantic Jazz Festival and serves as its Executive and Artistic Director. His work was acknowledged in 2012 by ABC Channel 7 News when he was selected as a Harris Hero for his amazing work with music students across the area. In March 2014, Paul received the prestigious *Howard University Benny Golson Jazz Master Award* for his outstanding work as a performer, presenter, and educator, and in March 2015, he received the County Executive's education award for Montgomery County Maryland.

**Robert Natter** is Associate Professor of Music and Director of Choral Activities at Gettysburg College, where he has taught since 1998. He conducts the Gettysburg College Choir, Concert Choir, Women's Choir and Camerata (a vocal chamber ensemble), and teaches conducting. The Gettysburg College Choir and Camerata have toured widely in

the eastern United States and internationally, with recent excursions to Nicaragua, Brazil, Canada, and Puerto Rico. They have toured to Nicaragua on four occasions, most recently in 2015, using a model that combines performance with service-learning and cultural immersion. The College Choir has also brought service learning closer to home. with benefit concerts in 2013 for Hurricane Sandy relief, and in 2014 for communities with food security issues. They have also performed for state conferences of the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association (PMEA) and American Choral Directors Association (ACDA). Natter is active as a guest conductor in the region, and serves on the executive board for the PA chapter of ACDA. He has been a leader in technology at Gettysburg College, creating and managing the recording facilities and technology lab for the conservatory. Natter earned B.A. and M.A. degrees in music from the University of California at Santa Cruz, and a D.M.A. in choral conducting from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music.

Ze'ev Dorman has made a significant mark as a conductor, instrumentalist, educator, and administrator. He studied Musicology and Conducting at the Rubin Academy of Music, Tel Aviv University, and at the Guildhall School of Music, London. Dorman joined the Israel Philharmonic Orchestra in 1969, and after completion of his professional studies in 1985, was appointed principal bassoonist and assistant conductor to Zubin Mehta. Ze'ev Dorman has maintained a vibrant independent conducting career, leading every major orchestra in Israel as well as orchestras in the US, Europe, and South America in major venues such as the Gewandhaus in Leipzig, Schauspielhaus in Berlin, the Alte Oper in Frankfurt, the Barbican in London, Tchaikovsky Hall in Moscow, Mann Auditorium in Tel Aviv, Teatro Real in Madrid, and the Tonhalle in Zurich. A significant portion of his career has been devoted to the training of musicians in Israel and the cultivation of future audiences. In 2004 he co-founded the Buchmann-Mehta School of Music at Tel Aviv University and was appointed head of its Orchestral Training Program. He subsequently served as Head of the Buchmann-Mehta School of Music from 2009 to 2015.

## Music at Gettysburg College

Ten years is a minute timeframe when viewed through the lens of our nation's most storied music conservatories, but for the Sunderman Conservatory of Music at Gettysburg College, it represents a significant milestone of both impact and progress.

During the 2015-16 academic year, the Sunderman Conservatory has been celebrating its 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary by hosting a number of marquee events on the Gettysburg campus and at the historic Majestic Theater. We are capping the year with residencies by two exciting groups of young virtuoso musicians—Decoda and JACK Quartet—a Symposium on *Making Music in the 21*<sup>st</sup> Century, and a gala concert by our own student ensembles featuring the College's choirs, Orchestra, Wind Symphony, and Jazz Ensemble.

The Sunderman Conservatory is truly making a name for itself as a dedicated place for music within a liberal arts college—a unique combination that fosters not only a rich intellectual climate, but also a synergy that inspires creative achievement. My colleagues and I are proud to provide a platform where our students are encouraged to pursue their passions—concertos and calculus, symphonies and science, harmony and history. I believe this broad-based music education lays the groundwork for career success, and more importantly, a fulfilling life.

We have come a long way. And while much progress has been made over the last decade, I would be remiss if I did not take a moment to recognize the longstanding music tradition out of which the Sunderman Conservatory has grown. Dedicated faculty, student musicians across the generations, and generous benefactors have been inextricably linked in the evolution of music at Gettysburg College. A major turning point came in 1945, after a determined group of women answered President Henry Hanson's challenge to raise \$50,000 as seed money to establish a music department. The College's Trustees approved the department, and Parker B. Wagnild served as its first chair. For some 60 years, the department influenced the lives of countless students—introducing the music major, supporting touring ensembles, and offering music courses to the general student population. A second defining turning point came in 2004, when renowned physician, scientist, and dedicated violinist,

Dr. F. William Sunderman '19, left a bequest of \$14 million—the largest gift in the College's history—to establish the Sunderman Conservatory of Music.

Since the founding of the Conservatory in 2005, the number of music majors and minors has increased threefold. The number of full-time faculty members has doubled. A Bachelor of Music in Performance degree was added to complement the Bachelor of Arts with a Major in Music and the Bachelor of Music Education degrees, and the program has gained accreditation from the National Association of Schools of Music.

It has been an honor to serve as Director of the Sunderman Conservatory for the past eight years. Now, in 2016, my colleagues and I are looking forward to a new decade in which we will direct our energies towards meeting the challenges of educating musicians in the 21<sup>st</sup> century and welcoming an ever more diverse population of talented musicians.
