About the Student Conductor Concert

The Wind Symphony Annual Student Conductor Concert creates an opportunity for students who have completed or are enrolled in MUS_CLAS 205 Conducting I to work with a large instrumental ensemble in rehearsal and performance. Conductors lead the musicians through the entire process, from first rehearsal to the concert. At the same time, musicians get to work with their peers in the preparation and performance of standard wind band literature.

All of this work is completed in only three rehearsals, teaching both performers and conductors about working on an accelerated schedule, a skill critical to the musician in the professional world. While in rehearsal, student conductors video-record their time on the podium and review it and their experiences with Russell McCutcheon, Director of Bands and Conductor of the Sunderman Conservatory Wind Symphony, working together to develop their ensemble leadership skills.

Bands in the Sunderman Conservatory

Now in its 109th year, the Gettysburg College band program is an essential part of the Sunderman Conservatory of Music and offers students, faculty, and community members the opportunity to enrich their lives through ensemble performance.

The Sunderman Conservatory Wind Symphony is the premier wind and percussion ensemble in the Sunderman Conservatory of Music. The Wind Symphony is comprised of a select group of musicians from almost every major on campus; only 45% of its members are music majors. The Wind Symphony rehearses and performs some of the best new literature and wind band masterworks in five concerts each year.

The Sunderman Conservatory Symphony Band meets in the spring semester and features a mix of students and other musicians from the college and greater Gettysburg area. The Bullets Marching Band is one of the few marching bands in Division III athletics and performs at all home football games, the Collegiate Marching Band Festival in Allentown, PA, and other invited events. Membership in any of these ensembles is open to all students, regardless of major or class year.
