One of the nicest, friendliest people you could meet here at the College is our very own Dr. Janet Morgan Riggs. As a student Janet met Ed, the love of her life, who also happens to be an alumnus from 1977. Janet graduated from Gettysburg College with a Bachelor of Arts Degree, she then went on to graduate from Princeton University with a Master's Degree and PhD in Social Psychology. Janet was offered her first position as a faculty member, a one-year position, by Dr. Mudd (chair of the Psychology Department at the time). Who knew then that history was in the making?!

Over her tenure at the College, Janet has served as a professor of Psychology, Interim Provost, Provost, Executive Assistant to the President, and currently as our 14th President of Gettysburg College. Janet and Ed raised their three children (now grown) in Gettysburg while juggling their careers. Janet recalls in the early days being mistaken as a student as she was trying to put materials on reserve in the library.

When asked what advice she would give to support staff, Janet replied, "Staff have a huge impact on our students, and in the way they interact with them. Every person matters. You can't overstate the value of kindness." What Janet will miss the most is the camaraderie and the "energy of our students."

When asked about her plans post-retirement, Janet said she is looking forward to some unscheduled time without commitments. She and Ed will be renovating their own house, going on a beach vacation, and planning additional travel. Janet is looking forward to having time to read and volunteer in the community. One of Janet's classmates described Janet the best, "No matter if you are a Board of Trustee member or a lecturer, Janet always treats you the same." When I asked staff members across campus to describe Janet, responses came quickly, such as: unique, friendly, special, a true

listener, sweet, understanding, helpful, supportive of the support staff council, knows you by name, and will be missed.

Another very special alumnus is our very own Carolyn Tuckey, Class of 1975, in none other than the Psychology Department. Carolyn, recalling memories as a student told me "the first time I stepped on campus in 1970, it has always been a friendly, welcoming, and

CONGRATULATIONS to two special ladies.


Remember, no matter what rung on the ladder we are on, we can all climb to be Gettysburg great!!

The mission of the Gettysburg College Safety Committee is "to further the institutional strategic initiatives through providing a safe and healthful living, *learning, and working environment."* The committee is comprised of delegates from across campus who meet monthly and serve as liaisons to share departmental safety issues and concerns as they relate to: procedures, policies, environmental heath, and specific workplace incidents. The committee also spends time reviewing ongoing or recurrent safety issues and makes recommendations or conducts safety audits on how to change behavior and implement safer practices.
