“Five Things a Virologist Has Learned from this Pandemic”

In addition to its terrible toll on the lives of millions of people, the current pandemic has led to remarkable insights into how viruses grow, spread, and cause disease. But even more, the past year and a half has caused many scientists to rethink how information is understood and used, how to communicate with the lay public, and how to define new, perhaps more authentic, paths forward.
