

CW/VFM-66: George L. Miner, 15th Connecticut, Co. A

Document. Muster-out from Company A, 15th Connecticut Volunteer Regiment, 3 May 1865 for Miner, who had been taken prisoner and paroled March 26, 1865. 1 D, 1 page

The 15th Connecticut was organized at New Haven on August 25th of 1862. It was involved mainly in lesser-known battles; however it did participate in the battle of Fredericksburg (12/12-15/1862) and was mustered out on July 12th of 1865.

Muster Roll:

Miner himself was taken prisoner on March 8th, 1865 and paroled on March 26th of that same year.

Otherwise, this document is simply an account of how much Miner was paid for his service to the Union.

Letter:

A typed transcript of a letter that is not included with the folder. It is written by John W Miner, probably a brother or a cousin to George. He writes to his wife about his time in the hospital and the death of Abraham Lincoln. Dated April 17th, 1865. Tms. 2pp
